	• Members were provided a copy of the 2023-2024 Budget
	• The financial reports for May-August were also provided to the members and reviewed.
	 In May there was income of \$1,940.19 from other fundraising (King Soopers and American Furniture Warehouse fundraising; \$794.48 from spirit wear sales; and \$5 from donations.
	 May expenses included: \$1,246.30 for staff appreciation; \$798.67 in Owl Grants; and \$321.44 in operation expenses for PTA training.
	 In June there was income of \$18.00 from donations and \$2,977.69 in spirit wear sales.
	 June expenses included: \$675.80 for staff appreciation and \$1,991.89 for the 8th grade continuation ceremony
	 In July there was only an expense of \$146.95 for payment of the CO quarterly sales tax.
	 In August there was income of \$9.00 from donations and \$58.91 in spirit wear sales.
	• August Expenses included: \$1,573.60 for ordering spirit wear.
	• In August there were \$930. in uncleared deposits and \$3,494.18 in the PayPal account which will be dispersed in September.

	• Spirit Wear:
	• Jim Wittwer mocked up some new designs for a crew neck sweatshirt from Be Branded which he presented to the members. Any shade of blue or green would be available.
	• It was proposed to not have a fundraiser this year. However, it was mentioned that if we wanted to have new spirit wear to sell, we would need to have a fundraiser in order to have the funds available for the new spirit wear order. This would mean that we will have to do Taking Flight again this year.
	• Members asked if it would be possible to have multiple different spirit wear options. Erin proposed that the members think about the two options proposed at the meeting and be ready to discuss at the next meeting;
	 Option one: Go with an online distributor so there is more variety for spirit wear options. However, the prices would be higher and the PTSA would not get any income from the sales.
	 Option two: Go with the local company and offer one new spirit wear option. We would have to order in bulk, but the price would be lower and the PTSA would get a portion of the sales.
	 Ideas were thrown out like: surveying students to see what they want for spirit wear. Tying the survey into fundraising was also suggested– for example: if you donate you get an opportunity to vote on the new spirit wear.

	 Library Mural: Tom Andrew and Tracy Schneider Tom and Tracy approached the PTSA about the possibility of helping fund a mural in the school library. The two met with muralist Molly McClure and discussed what they are looking for in a design. Mockups of possible designs would be

	 made available if we decide to proceed with the mural. However, members were provided with past examples of her work at the meeting. She has looked at the possible location for the mural and provided a quote of \$10,000. However, she did mention that she would be willing to lower the price since we are a 501(c) organization. The project would take about 2-3 weeks once started, but she could not start until November or December. Tracy has about \$2,000 to \$2,500 in book fair funds she could use towards the project and the PTSA has \$6,000 in funds carried over from previous years we could use towards the project. We discussed approaching Ms. McClure with the possibility of creating the mural for the funds we currently have available for the project. The members asked if there was a possibility for creating student involvement in the mural process. Some examples thrown out included: involving the art classes, involving the art club, letting kids vote on the different mock ups. Alyssa Drew made a motion for Erin to have further discussions with the artist and provide us with mock ups for possible designs. Heather Salas seconded the motion. There was no opposition. The PTSA hopes to have possible designs available at the next meeting.

	a possible partnership.

The extra time will be used to provide students with extra support and time with teachers as needed. The school is using the results from the MAP testing to see where OWL time can be used to close any gaps they may find. School clubs are starting! Posters can be found around the school. We are wrapping up the Fall sports season.
